SUBJECT:

Local Area Program Year 2016 WIOA Annual Report

1. Purpose.

To provide Local Areas with information concerning the Program Year 2016 Annual Report.

2. Discussion.

Each program year the State of Alabama normally submits an Annual Report Narrative to the U.S. Department of Labor (USDOL) in accordance with Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) Section 185. To assist with this report local areas submit an Annual Report to the State to provide needed information. However, the State has been informed by the USDOL Region III office that no Annual Report Narrative portion will be required for the state's Program Year (PY) 2016 Annual Report. Based upon the guidance provided by the Regional Office, this portion of the Report is still under development for WIOA. Only the data portion of the Report is required for PY16. Since the USDOL is not requiring the State of Alabama to submit an Annual Report Narrative for PY16, the state is not requiring local areas to submit an Annual Report to the state for this year.

3. Action.

No action is required. Local areas should note that an Annual Report for PY16 is not required by the State at this time. However, this does not preclude local areas from any local requirements in regard to reports required by local workforce development boards.

Hi Rachel:

Since some of my staff do a substantial amount of work on the WIOA Annual Report Narratives – usually due about 9/30 or 10/01 of each year, do you know when ETA will be putting out the Guidance for development of the PY2016 WIOA Annual Report Narrative? The reason that I'm asking in July is due to the timeline usually required to get the report drafted and checked for ADA compliance. Last year, we had to ask Lane for extra time beyond the due date. We rely on the Alabama Department of Rehabilitation Services to run the ADA compliance check on their systems and help us "fix" any issues. Also, the Administrative Assistant, who had worked for me for several years, has just retired; so we have a person, who no experience in putting this together for us. We don't want to request "extra" time again this year if at all possible. The SETA Conference and a State Conference will "eat up staff time" during September.

If you have any contact with the staff in D.C. that will be drafting the guidance, the earlier the guidance is issued would benefit all of us.

Hi State Leads – this question on calculating ETP cost was asked by one of our Region 3 states a while ago. I'm sharing DC's response with everyone in case you had a similar question.

Q: How do we determine cost per participant for ETPL? Is per program or entire provider used to determine cost per participant? Do we add cost of the full WIOA contract funds including administrative or just program funds (ITAs) / all participants in the program? How do they want us to calculate this measure with the numerator and denominator?

A: The specifications will be addressed in the Joint ICR. Cost per WIOA Participant Served is to be completed by states. The numerator is the aggregate summation of all WIOA ITA funds expended by the state for all WIOA participants, in all programs of study, within the reporting period. The denominator is Total Number of WIOA Participants.

Hello State Performance Leads—below are answers to questions that came up on 6/9.

- 1. States will have to conduct DEV for trade and SCSEP.
- 2. The only Special Project Code is for multiple Dislocated Worker Programs. Use the first 7 digits of the second project code. (If this response is unclear, let me know.) The Pay for Performance Code

guidance should be out later this year. DC stated that older programs such as VRAP is closed out and any future reporting will be minimal. For short term or new programs, there will be a second field added and guidance will be developed. REA (UI) – expired 4 years ago – there won't be new participants, and no future tracking. OBIT – Washington requested to know the justification for creating a special code for OBIT (does the state have high numbers to exit in a future PY?)

3. ETP Calculation - Still working on getting a clear response for this.

4. Aged out of Foster Care - Additional research required by DC.

5. Exit Date for Reportable Individuals – DC is aware of the issue associated with this element; I am told it will be fixed for PY 17. For PY 16, states are entering "0" and not entering an exit date to avoid duplicating the same ID.

My next national call will be 6/26 – and I'll need your questions by 6/21. Note, if prior questions have still been unanswered, you may resubmit those to me.

Subject: RE: Follow up on MSG and Q4 Data Reporting from the 6/9 Performance Call

Hi All, following up on the MSG and Q4 Data Report items:

- 1. States are expected to report Q4 data on the same timeline as other quarterly reports, i.e., Q4 is due by 8/15. The annual data report will be due in October. Remember, no annual narrative is required for PY 16.
- 2. (MSG) See the pasted block below from the pre-con session held in Dallas/DC. This is in the TEGL 10-16, Change 1 that will be out soon. It's not changing the measure at all. It's revising the specifications to correct an error. In the current way the specifications are written now there is no way for a participant once in MSG to ever exit MSG regardless of whether or not the training/education has ended. Obviously that is not aligned with the intent of the measure. Only participants actively in education or training are in MSG so if a participant is still active in receiving services but no longer in education or training without an end date to signal an exit from the denominator of MSG s/he remained in the pool.
