



Employment Compensation

- Be Prepared: Government issued ID #, Social Security #,
 Past Employment History, etc...
- Two ways to file: by Phone or Computer
- Open your claim after your last day of work
- Federal Taxes: Weekly payments are taxable; you can have it taken out now or pay later
- Save your **PIN** # and **call-in number** to file weekly claim
- Questions call UC Q&A Inquiry line 1-800-361-4524
- **Do your weekly certification** at the beginning of each week
- Able, Available & Actively Seeking Work
- 2 Ways to get paid: Direct Deposit or Debit Card
- Severance Pay does not affect your unemployment
- Unemployment last 14 weeks and pays a maximum of \$275 per week

- > The first week is a hold week you will not be paid for this week
- If you earn less than \$275 during the last week of work, file weekly certification the following week and every week thereafter
- Length of time processing may vary depending on your selection of direct deposit or a debit card
- Plan on you first payment deposited during the 3rd week and will include any back payments


VRS provides specialized employment- and education-related services and training to assist teens and adults with disabilities in becoming employed.
